Celestial Grace Temple The Book of Enoch - Chapter 74



Enoch was the son of Jared, the father of Methuselah, and the great-grandfather of Noah. It is believed that Enoch was born in 3328 BC, 622 years after the birth of Adam. The Bible states that Enoch lived 365 years before he was taken by God.

The Book of Enoch, written during the second century B.C. is one of the most important non-canonical apocryphal works, and had a huge influence on early Christian beliefs, specifically among Gnostic believers, and those that truly believed in divine salvation.

Enoch is believed to have had direct contact with God's most holy of angels, and describes visions of heaven and hell, angelic beings and devils, and introduced concepts such as fallen angels, the Luminaries, the Nephilim, the Watchers, and the appearance of a Messiah, Resurrection, a Final Judgement, and a Heavenly Kingdom on Earth. Interspersed with this material are scientific digressions on calendrical systems, geography, cosmology, astronomy, and meteorology.

Chapter 74

- **P1.** And I saw another course, a law for Moon, and how according to that law the Moon performs its monthly revolution.
- **P2.** And all these Uriel, the holy angel who is the leader of them all, showed to me, and their positions, and I wrote down their positions as he showed them to me, and I wrote down their months as they were, and the appearance of their lights till fifteen days were accomplished.
- **P3.** In single seventh parts she accomplishes all its light in the east, and in single seventh parts accomplishes all its darkness in the west.

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- **P4.** And in certain months she alters its settings, and in certain months it pursues its own peculiar course.
- **P5.** In two months the Moon sets with the Sun, in those two middle portals the third and the fourth.
- **P6.** It goes forth for seven days, and turns about and returns again through the portal where the Sun rises, and accomplishes all its light, and it recedes from the Sun, and in eight days enters the sixth portal from which the sun goes forth.
- **P7.** And when the Sun goes forth from the fourth portal it goes forth seven days, then until Moon goes forth from the fifth and turns back again in seven days into the fourth portal and accomplishes all its light and it recedes and enters into the first portal in eight days.
- **P8.** And the Moon returns again in seven days into the fourth portal, from which the Sun goes forth.
- **P9.** Thus I saw their position how the Moon rose and the Sun set in those days.
- **P10.** And if five years are added together the Sun has an over-plus of thirty days, and all the days which accrue to it for one of those five years, when they are full, amount to 364 days.
- **P11.** And the over-plus of the Sun and of the Stars amounts to six days: In 5 years 6 days every year come to 30 days: and the Moon falls behind the Sun and Stars to the number of 30 days.

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P12. And the Sun and the stars bring in all the years exactly, so that they do not advance or delay their position by a single day unto eternity; but complete the years with perfect justice in 364 days.

P13. In 3 years there are 1092 days, and in 5 years 1820 days, so that in 8 years there are 2912 days.

P14. For the Moon alone the days amount in 3 years to 1062 days, and in 5 years it falls 50 days behind: To the sum of 1770 there is to be added 1000 and 62 days.

P15. And in 5 years there are 1770 days, so that for the Moon the days in 8 years amount to 2832 days.

P16. For in 8 years it falls behind to the amount of 80 days, all the days it falls behind in 8 years are 80.

P17. And the year is accurately completed in conformity with their world-stations and the stations of the Sun, which rise from the portals through which it the Sun rises and sets 30 days.
